## **BEGOTTEN OF GOD**

## INTRODUCTION

- Purpose of letter: 1) unbelieving Jews denied the deity of Jesus, saying, Jesus is not Christ.
  - the Gnostics denied the humanity of Jesus, saying, Christ was not Jesus.
     This group claimed superior knowledge. They concluded that it was impossible for sinless deity to occupy a sinful body. They also concluded that once regenerated, they were pure in spirit;
- "begotten of God" new birth; spiritual birth; newness of life; born again; a Christian. (John 3:3-6: James 1:18: 1 John 3:1)
- 1. (1 John 2:29) "... every one that does righteousness is born of him"

so, it did not matter what behavior the body engaged in.

Know that Jesus is righteous: His attitude was (John 4:34) "do the will of him that sent me" "does righteousness" - (Psa. 119:172) "for all thy commandments are righteousness" (Rms. 6:1-2; John 14:15; John 15:10, 14)

- 2. (1 John 3:9) "whosoever is born of God does not commit sin ... cannot sin"
  - "does not commit sin" not habitually sin; not keep on sinning; not our life-style.

    "seed remains in him" the word that begat us will sustain us. (Psalm 119:11 v101-106)

    "cannot sin" not a statement of impossibility; rather, I don't want to and will not.

    It's against my spiritual nature, and I have no desire to sin, and you can't make me.

    I will be a law-biding citizen in the kingdom. I cannot willfully break the law.

When we do sin: (1 John 1:4-10)

3. (1 John 4:7-8) "love one another ... every one that loves is born of God ... "

An illustration from family love: look at what families do for one another. Now we are in God's family, and just as love is God's nature, let's "love one another."

4. (1 John 5:1) "whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God ... "

This is the opposite of what many in our world believe; but, we keep believing it. (v1-2) includes: "love him that begat ... love the begotten ... keep his commandments"

- 5. (1 John 5:4) "whatsoever is born of God over-cometh the world ... even our faith"
  - (v3) the commandments of God are not grievous to us because it's in our nature to keep them. It's our "faith" that doing God's will gives us the "victory" Hymn #469
- 6. (1 John 5:18) "whosoever is born of God sins not ... keeps himself ... "

It's God who keeps us (John 10:27-30); but, we have responsibility, too. "wicked one touches him not" - (1 Peter 5:8-9; James 1:12, 4:7)
