(Acts 2:36-42)

WHY DO I WORSHIP HERE?

1. Because the Bible is our only authority for our belief and practice.

(John 12:48-49; Gal. 1:6-9; Rev. 22:18-19)

2. Because of the name we wear.

The new name was prophesied: (Isaiah 56:5; Isaiah 62:2)
The new name is identified in the NT: (Acts 11:26; Acts 26:28; 1 Peter 4:16)
As a group, a Biblical name is: (Rms. 16:16) "... the churches of Christ salute you"

3. Because the preacher does not use the titles "reverend" or "pastor."

"Pastor" does have reference to one who tends a flock, a shepherd.

This is a synonym for a group of men in the Bible also known as: elders, bishops, presbyters, overseers.

(1 Peter 5:1-2; 1 Tim. 3:1; 1 Tim. 4:14; Acts 20:17, v28)

"Reverend" is used in the Bible to describe God's name: (Psalm 111:9)

4. Because of the manner of the worship assembly: (Acts 2:42)

Giving (1 Cor. 16:2, 2 Cor. 9:7). Lord's supper (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:23-34). Praying. Singing (Eph. 5:19, Col. 3:16-17). Preaching.

5. Because of the Bible teaching on salvation.
