INTRODUCTION

(Job 12:12) "With the ancient is wisdom; and in length of days understanding."

(Psalm 92:12-15) "The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree: he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon. Those that be planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing; to show that the Lord is upright: he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him"

(Joshua 14:11) "as my strength was then, even so is my strength now"

(Psalm 31:14-15) "O Lord ... my times are in thy hand"

2. CALEB HAD A SENSE OF DIVINE PURPOSE

(Joshua 14:12) "Now therefore give me this mountain, whereof the Lord spake in that day ... "

There isn't a mandatory retirement age with God.

(Titus 2:2-5) "But the older men be ... The aged women likewise, that they be ... "

3. CALEB WAS OBEDIENT TO THE LORD

(Joshua 14:8) "I wholly followed the Lord" (v14) "he wholly followed the Lord God of Israel"

That's a secret to spiritual success, start young.

(Ecc. 12:1) "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth ... "
