DOCTRINE MATTERS

INTRODUCTION

- "Matters" important; significant; of consequence; has substance.
- "Doctrine" the act of teaching or giving instruction and what is taught (content).

1. DOCTRINE IS IMPORTANT

When the church began, (Acts 2:42) "they continued stedfastly in the apostles' doctrine ... "

- When Jesus taught, (Matt. 7:28-29) "the people were astonished at his doctrine: for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes."
- (Matt. 15:9) "But in vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men."
 - The people were astonished at the "doctrine" (singular) delivered by Jesus, but there are "doctrines" (plural) based on commandments of men.
 - Jesus taught: worship is vain when people teach "for doctrines the commandments of men." It's an "authority" problem.

2. DOCTRINE IS HEALTHY

- (Titus 2:1) "But speak thou the things which become sound doctrine."
- "Sound" to be well; to be in good health; our English word "hygiene."
- (2 Tim. 4:3) "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine ... " meaning, society prefers a "fast food" only menu, and that's not healthy.
 - (Acts 20:32) "I commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance ... "

3. DOCTRINE IS PREVENTIVE

- (1 Tim. 4:1-6) "... some shall depart from the faith ... put the brethren in remembrance of these things ... nourished up in the words of faith and of good doctrine ... "
- (Jude v3-4) "earnestly contend for the faith ... certain men crept in unawares ... "
- (Rms. 16:17) "... contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned ... "
- (Titus 1:9) "Holding fast the faithful word as he has been taught, that he may be able by sound doctrine both to exhort and convince the gainsayers."
- 4. DOCTRINE IS NECESSARY FOR SALVATION (1 Tim. 4:16 and 2 John v9)
