INTRODUCTION

We recognize degrees of friendship: fair-weather, casual, dear, old, or "He's no friend."

Friendship is difficult to define; however, we recognize or know it when we see it.

5 BIBLICAL REFERENCES TO "FRIENDS"

1. (Job 6:14) "To him who is afflicted, kindness (pity) should be shown by his friends"

Job's friends were "fair-weather," and Job knew how they were supposed to act. (Job 16:20) "My friends scorn me" (Job 19:14, v19, v21)

2. (Psalm 41:9) "Even my own familiar friend in whom I trusted, who ate my bread, has lifted up his heel against me"

"Trusted" - belief in the integrity, ability, or genuineness of someone.

"Who ate my bread" - friends share meals together, fellowship, are comrades.

"Lifted his heel against me" - betrayed the trust; two-faced; double-crossed.

Example of Judas: (Matthew 26:14-16, v20, v50)

3. (Proverbs 17:17) "A friend loves at all times"

Peter starts out OK - (Matthew 26:35) Then Peter proved differently - (Matthew 26:74-75)

4. (Proverbs 18:24) "A man who has friends must show himself friendly, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother"

"Friendly" - a kindly concern, interest, or support toward another; neighborly. "A friend who sticks closer than a brother" - reference to a family virtue.

5. (Proverbs 27:6) "Faithful are the wounds of a friend, but the kisses of an enemy are deceitful" (v9) "... the sweetness of a man's friend gives delight by hearty counsel"

At times, we need a friend to intervene and tell us to "Shape up!"
"Hearty counsel" - received correctly it is like ointment and perfume; delightful.
(Galatians 4:16) "Have I therefore become your enemy because I tell you the truth?"

CLOSE - Jesus may become the dearest friend you ever had.

(John 15:13) "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" Jesus did that!

Will you be a friend to Jesus?

(John 15:14) "You are My friends if you do whatever I command you"
