A SUCCESSFUL MINISTER / MINISTRY

(1 Thessalonians 2:1-12)

INTRODUCTION - Paul sets himself as an example for preachers today.

1. HOW ONE HANDLES THE GOSPEL

1) "We were bold ... to speak to you the gospel" "Bold" - having courage in our God; confident; daring; spirited. (Eph. 6:19) "Pray for me ... that I may open my mouth boldly ... "

2) (v4) "entrusted with the gospel, even so we speak" "Entrusted" - something valuable being placed in the hands of another for proper use. (1 Cor. 9:16-17) "I have been entrusted with a stewardship"

3) (v3-6) "not" "not from error ("guile") - exhortation was not subtle, underhanded, nor cunning. "not from uncleanness" - in contrast to the immorality of the heathen worship of the day. "not from deceit" - motives are pure; no intention of misleading; not dishonest. (v4) "not as pleasing men" - not a crowd-pleasing message. (note: Isaiah 30:9-11) "not using flattering words ... nor a cloak for covetousness" - no false praise for financial gain; not covering up anything for selfish gain. "nor did we seek glory from men" - didn't preach to get your praise and applause.

4) (v6) "when we might have made demands as apostles"

Paul could have asked for financial support from them.

(v9) "laboring ... that we might not be a burden to you." Paul had partial financial support from being a tent-maker: (Acts 18:1-3). Paul received financial support from other churches: (Phil. 4:15-17). Today, many congregations cannot afford full financial support for their preacher, and he may be required to be employed in society.

2. HOW ONE HANDLES PEOPLE

- 1) (v7) "we were gentle ... as a nursing mother cherishes her own children"
- 2) (v11) "as a father does his own children" preach with the firmness of a dad.
- 3) (v8) "affectionately ... pleased to impart to you ... our own lives" involvement with them.
- 3. HOW ONE HANDLES HIMSELF (v10) "we behaved ourselves among you"

 - "devoutly" devotion to God and to the preaching of the gospel.
 "justly" the right fulfillment of duties; in accordance with what is right.
 - 3) "blamelessly" no provable charge for misdeeds; a proper example; above reproach.

4. HOW ONE SEES THE GOAL OF HIS MINISTRY

(v12) "that you would walk worthy of God ... " (Eph. 4:1) "walk worthy of the calling with which you were called ... " (3 John v4) "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth."

CLOSE: Preachers, follow Paul's lead in preaching the gospel.
