"NAMES FOR US" sermon continued: "MEMBERS"

INTRODUCTION - (Rms. 12:5) "we who are many, are 1 body in Christ, members 1 of another"

(1 Cor. 12:27) "Now ye are the body of Christ, and each of you is a part of it"  
(1 Corinthians 12:12-27) gives at least 4 lessons on "body-life."

1. (1 Cor. 12:14) "For the body is not one member, but many"

(v15-19) "If the foot ... hand ... ear ... eye ... all one member, where were the body?"  
If all are the same member, the body wouldn't work efficiently; wouldn't work at all.

2. (v20) "But now are they many members, yet but one body"

"One" - a single thing or unit; not two or more; solitary; without others.  
"Body" - (Eph. 2:22-23 and Col. 1:18) "... the church"  
(v4-6) "... differences ... same Spirit ... Lord ... God which works all in all"  
(Eph. 4:3-4) "... There is one body"

3. (v21) "And the eye cannot say to the hand, I have no need of you:  
nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you"

Everyone Is Needed article: Xvxn though my typxwritxr is an old modxl, it works wxll

IT SURX MAKXS A DIFFXRXNCX!"

(v22) "much more those members of the body, which seem to be more feeble, are necessary"

(Romans 12:3, v6-8)

4. (v25) "That there should be no schism (division) in the body ..."
