

## SALVATION: OURS AND NOAH'S

(Genesis 6:13 – 22)

### 1. SAVED BY GRACE

(Genesis 6:8) "But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord"

(Ephesians 2:8-10) "For by grace you have been saved ... not of yourselves ... not of works"

(Romans 3:10) "There is none righteous, no, not one"

God voluntarily (being gracious) provided for us a gift (salvation) that we needed and could not provide for ourselves.

Grace is God's favor toward us that we did not earn nor merit.

### 2. SAVED BY FAITH

(Hebrews 11:7) "By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household ... "

(Ephesians 2:8) "For by grace you have been saved by faith ... "

(Heb. 11:6) "without faith it is impossible to please Him ... "

(John 8:24) "I said to you that you will die in your sins, for if you do not believe that I am He, you will die in your sins."

### 3. SAVED BY OBEDIENCE

(Heb. 11:7) "By faith Noah, ... moved with godly fear, prepared an ark ... "

(Genesis 6:22) "thus did Noah, according to all that God commanded him, so did he"

(Gen. 7:5) "Noah did according to all that the Lord commanded him"

(Gen. 7:9) "... as God had commanded Noah"

(Gen. 7:16) "... as God had commanded him: and the Lord shut him in"

(Matthew 7:21) "Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."

(Hebrews 5:9) "... the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him"

(Acts 2:37) "... What shall we do?" Apostles answered, (v38) "Repent, and be baptized every one of you ... "

(v40) "... Be saved from this perverse generation. Then those who gladly received his word were baptized ... "

(v47) "... and the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved"

The book of Romans begins (1:5) and ends (16:26) with the phrase  
"obedience to the faith"

### 4. SAVED BY WATER

(1 Peter 3:20) "... eight souls were saved through water"

(v21) "the like figure whereunto even baptism does also now save us ... "
